



Recommended Canine Vaccination Schedules

**Heartworm preventative should be started at 6 weeks of age. The cost of preventative varies according to the type of preventative used and the weight of the dog. Dosage will need to be adjusted as the weight of the puppy increases. Deworming should be performed every visit or the client may elect to purchase deworming medication and administer according to directions.

**Outside dogs and dogs exposed to tick infested areas should be vaccinated against Lyme's Disease. Two vaccinations are recommended initially and then once a year.

Other vaccinations recommended for outside dogs and dogs exposed to tick infested areas:

Physical Exam

 Two vaccinations to be given 3 weeks apart initially, then annually thereafter.
 Rattlesnake Vaccine

Other Considerations for our Adult Canine Friends:

T4 - A blood test to detect Hypothyroidism, which is a disease caused by insufficient levels or the body's abnormal use of thyroid hormones. Symptoms include reduced stamina, increased sleeping, dry skin, dark pigment in the skin, premature graying of the muzzle and reduced fertility.

Geriatric Wellness Screen - A series of laboratory tests to determine various organ functions.

- CBC (Complete Blood Count)
- Urinalysis and/or ERD (Early Renal Disease) tests
- Chest Exam/Radiographs
- EKG
- Chemistry Panels
- Electrolyte Panels
